FALL INSPECTION CHECKLIST

Safety first, and as always, only perform tasks you're comfortable with & can do safely. Contact a professional for everything else.

Your "fall" inspection should be fairly easy if you already completed one for "spring." The ultimate goal, is to prepare your home for the harsh winter months that may be coming.

FALL (GROUNDS)		
	Clean & put away all summer furnishings .	
	Prep lawn trimming equipment for winter storage (fuel stabilizer, etc.)	
	Prepare fall & winter equipment (leaf/snow blowers, etc.) for service (oil change, plugs etc.)	
	Trim shrubs & tree limbs away from house & utility lines using "EXTREME CAUTION!"	
	Completely drain irrigation systems of all water.	
	Check storm drains & channel drains for debris & blockages.	
	Seal cracks in driveways & patios to help prevent winter ice heaving.	
FALL (HOUSE EXTERIOR)		
	Internally shutoff all hose bibs & water sources .	
	· ·	
	Inspect garage doors & weatherstripping for wear & damage.	
	Inspect & service garage door hardware & openers for smooth operation (oil, tighten)	
	Check & seal all foundation cracks .	
	Clean & secure "pest cage" on laundry & kitchen vent hoods.	
	Inspect & caulk vulnerable gaps in siding & around windows & doors.	
	Look for loose or peeling paint on woodwork. Prime & one finish coat the exposed areas until a full paint job can be performed.	
	Service & clean storm windows , if present.	
	Check all stairs and rails for sturdiness.	
	Check exterior light fixtures for damage.	
	Ensure all exterior outlets are Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI) protected.	
	Test all GFCI receptacles using the built-in test button .	

FALL (ROOF)		
Note: Use Binoculars for roof inspection or hire a professional		
	Inspect gutter downspouts for secure connections to the house & gutters above.	
	Ensure gutter downspouts drain far enough away from your foundation.	
	Inspect gutters for debris , fastening & proper pitch toward downspouts.	
	Safely make a visual inspection of roof for areas of sagging or bulging shingles .	
	Inspect roofing for missing, damaged or dislodged shingles.	
	Inspect chimney bricks for damage & cracks.	
	Inspect chimney for worn or missing mortar joints.	
	Inspect chimney cap (if present) for damage & a secure connection to the crown.	
	Inspect chimney crown for cracks, damage & missing mortar.	
FALL (INTERIORS)

	Check for signs of roof leakage , particularly around vents, chimneys & valley areas.	
	Check for adequate insulation as well as condition, position & coverage.	
	Look for signs of moisture buildup. (mildew, underside roof discoloration)	
	Check ventilation openings (gable/soffit) for blockages (insulation, nests, etc.)	
(Rooms)		
	Check all areas for signs of roof or plumbing leakage (stains, scaling paint, etc.)	
	Have any fireplaces or wood stoves & flues checked & professionally cleaned.	
	Check all smoke & carbon monoxide detectors . Replace batteries & test unit.	
	Test GFCI receptacles in bathroom & kitchen areas.	
	Vacuum & clean all radiators, & air supply/return grilles.	
	Winterize or remove & store room air conditioners.	
	Inspect window sills where a/c units were, for water damage.	
	Switch ceiling fans to rotate clockwise to circulate higher "warmer" air.	

(B	asement)
	Check all smoke & carbon monoxide detectors. Replace batteries & test unit.
	Replace furnace filter and schedule a professional service & cleaning.
	Drain or insulate water lines that are vulnerable to freezing.
	Check temperature setting of the water heater. Follow manufacturer's recommended settings.
	Inspect entire plumbing system & fixture locations for signs of leaks or blockages.
	Confirm proper operation & drain flow for sump pumps , if present.
F۵	ALL (ADDITIONAL TIPS)
	In addition to servicing, organize snow equipment (blower, shovels, ice melt) where they'd be easier to retrieve in the event of a sudden storm.
	Clean & service your electrical generator , if you have one. (change fuel, oil, etc.)
	Service chainsaws & sharpen or replace chains.
	Purchase fuel oil if possible, before colder months arrive & rates increase.
	Research better electricity rates through winter, to potentially save on increased usage (room heaters, holiday lighting, etc.)
